Series Points

Points will be allocated on the finishing position within each round on the following basis.

Riders will get 5 bonus points for attending and completing each of the rounds.

Please note a completed round is a rider that completes **all of the finals** whether that be Main or B finals all three finals must be completed to get series points.

Overall final of the series will be held at the last region race meeting of 2017, dependant of 2017/2018 Race Calendar.

At the end of the series, points will be calculated for each rider that have completed 3 rounds plus the final. The top 8 from each age group will be decided from each rider's best 3 rounds and the final within each class.

Equal placings

In all cases a count back to the highest finishing position in the last race will be used.

Commissaries have jurisdiction to alter these rules in the interests of Health and Safety, fair racing and payback
