TE AWAMUTU ONLY (not part of the superclass series):

Mini (9 – 10yrs) no riding up

Race Format:

9 or more riders 4 Moto's top 8 to final

Consolation finals to determine points for series

8 or less riders 4 Moto's points over

Minimum class size: 4 riders constitute a class

Race Format – TE AWAMUTU ONLY:

9 or more riders 2 Moto's Saturday and 2 Moto's Sunday, Top 8 to final

Consolation finals to determine points for series

8 or less riders 2 Moto's Saturday and 2 Moto's Sunday, points over

Minimum class size: 4 riders constitute a class

NOTE: All Mini 9-10yrs class must also ride the Rangī Memorial challenge class.

Race Day Purse

Payout to Top 8 only on each class (where applicable).
Purse is a minimum of \$1000 per Round (class dependent) split proportionally across all classes, plus \$25 per entry towards total purse.
The Mini (9-10yrs) class purse will be made up of the \$30 entry fee and will be split proportionally across only the Mini class.

Classes

Mini (9-10yrs) – TE AWAMUTU ONLY Riders MUST be UCI 9 to enter this event - no riding up
Junior (11-12yrs) – Riders MUST be UCI 11 to enter this event – no riding up
Intermediate (13-14yrs) – Riders can ride up into next class
Senior Men (15+) Challenge: -Challenge track only
Senior Men (15+) Pro TA & CB Tracks; Championship riders must enter this class
Women (13+) 13-14 Year Old: Can either rider this class or Intermediate

NOTE: The Mini (9-10yrs) is not part of the Waikato Superclass series and is only held at the Te Awamutu round. All Mini (9-10yrs) Superclass riders must also be entered in the Rangi Memorial Challenge Class.

Series Points

Points will be allocated on the finishing position within each round on the following basis.
Riders will get **5 bonus points** for attending and completing each of the rounds.
Please note a completed round is a rider that completes the final, whether that be **Main or B final**. If a rider has been dropped from 9 or less riders, that rider will get last place plus 3 points.
Overall final of the series will be held at the last region race meeting of 2020, dependent of 2020 Race Calendar.
At the end of the series, points will be calculated for each rider that have completed 3 rounds plus the final. The top 8 from each age group will be decided from each rider's best 3 rounds and the final within each class.
The Mini (9-10yrs) class is not part of the series points.

Equal placings: In all cases, a count back to the highest finishing position in the last race will be used.

Commissaires: Have jurisdiction to alter these rules in the interests of Health and Safety, fair racing and payback.



Event Health & Safety Statement: By entering this event you acknowledge to have read & understood the event H&S statement below.

Safety and safe practices at all BMXNZ calendared events are not negotiable and failure by anyone to comply by the code of conduct or rules of the sport will result in the removal of such person from the event facility.
